Alignment to U.S. Federal Funding Priorities

Pixton can easily be purchased with federal funds allotted to schools and districts. This document explains how Pixton aligns with various federal programs. This is not an exhaustive list, and you may wish to seek additional guidance from your school or district's federal program administrator.

Title I: Improving the Academic Achievment of the Disadvantaged

- Title I, Part A: Improving Basic Programs Operated by Local Educational Agencies
 - Schools may use Title I, Part A funds for the purchase of instructional tools and materials such as Pixton, as well as professional development to support the implementation of these tools.
- Title I, Part C: Education of Migratory Children
 - Pixton is an ideal tool for outreach and communication. Educators can create engaging comics in multiple languages and at various reading levels to ensure that migratory children and their families gain information and access to essential services.
 - Pixton can help meet the unique educational needs of migratory children by adding fun to summer or afterschool programs, strengthening students' understanding of core subjects,

- and building interest in reading and writing.
 Pixton can be used on virtually any device with a browser, ensuring that technology access is not a barrier to learning.
- Title I, Part D: Prevention and Intervention Programs for Children and Youth who are Neglected, Delinquent, or At Risk
 - Pixton includes more than 50 engaging Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Lesson Ideas that can be used to support at-risk youth.
 - Child and family therapy professionals use Pixton in a variety of ways to promote social emotional development.
